

# **FIM ROAD SAFETY TROPHY**

## GENERAL INFORMATION



The Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM) is pleased to call for nominations for its Annual Road Safety Trophy. In 2022, the eleventh edition of this Trophy will take place, which was instituted as part of the FIM's contribution to the United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety. Naturally the Trophy is **focused on improving road safety for riders of powered two wheelers – motorcycles, scooters and mopeds**.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

The FIM Road Safety Trophy may be awarded to an individual, a club, a national federation, a governmental organisation, a non-governmental organisation, or a commercial entity.

The history of this Trophy illustrates its scope well:

**2010:** Greig Craft and the AIP Foundation for low cost motorcycle safety helmets in middle- and low-income countries.

**2011:** Andrés Perez Rubio, former motorcycle racing champion, for his work for road safety, in particular safety barrier on the open roads.

**2012:** Ian Burrell MBE and the Ambulance Motorcycle Club of the UK for the CRASH Card (helmet medical card now more than a million distributed worldwide).

**2013:** The United Kingdom Department for Transport for the SHARP star rating system of independent testing of helmets – modelled on the star rating system for cars.

**2014:** The KNMV (Royal Dutch Motorcycle Federation) for their work in developing scientifically proven risk awareness training for road riders.

**2015:** Mr Tony Rich, patrol officer in the AA, for his concept for a cycle and motorcycle "awareness" programme directed at drivers. This has become an international campaign promoted by FIA Region One.

**2016:** Federazione Motociclista Italiana (FMI) for its Road Safety Training programme.

**2017:** The Norwegian Motorcycle Union NMCU for their work on the rider training manual Full Kontroll.

**2018**: Michael Woodford MBE and the Safer Roads Foundation for their work in promoting, "automatic headlights on" technology to be fitted to all motorcycles sold across the world - not just those marketed in Europe and North America. Also, for their advocacy to the motorcycle industry to fit all motorcycles with an anti-lock braking system.

**2019**: MotoCAP for its website testing and reviewing the comfort and effectiveness of motorcycle clothing on sale in Australia.

2020: no programme launched due the Covid-19 pandemic.



**2021:** no candidatures received due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

## **TROPHY PRESENTATION**

This takes place at the annual FIM Awards Prize Giving Ceremony.

#### **NOMINATIONS**

Nomination proposals may be submitted by an individual, or by an individual acting on behalf of an organisation (for example a FIM FMN). To present a nomination to the FIM for the Road Safety Trophy, you must:

- Send all documentation in English only
- Describe the individual or organisation you wish to present
- Briefly explain how their work contributes to improving road safety for riders
- Include your contact details in case the judges or the FIM Administration have any further inquiries to make concerning the nomination.

Please submit your nomination as early as possible, but no later than 31 August 2022.
