## **MXGP of Jakarta Cancelled**

The FIM, Infront Moto Racing and the local organiser regret to announce the cancellation of the MXGP of Jakarta which was set to take place on 2/3 July. Despite immense efforts, the local organiser was not able to facilitate the correct running of this year's event.

All stakeholders look forward to returning to Jakarta for FIM Motocross World Championship in the future. In the meantime, they will concentrate their efforts on the upcoming MXGP of Indonesia which will run in Samota-Sumbawa on 25/26 June. This event was officially presented to the national media in the presence of Dr H.
