# FIM SIDECAR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP – AUTODROM MOST (CZECH REPUBLIC)

#### 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Autodrom Most, on behalf of CEO Josef Zajíček and the ACCR, Motor Presse Stuttgart GmbH & Co. KG and the Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme, organises a round of the FIM Sidecar World Championship.

Access to the Circuit will be authorised from 22.6. from 12.00 o'clock by the main entrance of the Circuit.

The positioning of the competitors in the paddock will be subject to prior authorisation from the organisation.

It is forbidden to the competitors and users of the Working Paddock and the Support Paddock to fit any metal objects in our asphalt surfaces such as tent pegs, nails. In the event of a disrespect of these rules, the competitors may be penalised and/or fined.

The entry fee is **800 EUR**.

Deadline: Applications shall be approved by the rider's FMN and shall be made not later than **09.06.2023** midnight. Exception to the deadline can be granted at the sole discretion of the Promoter & FIM.

The Promoter will select the applications and advise teams within 72 hours after the closing date of entries whether their applications have been accepted or rejected.

# 7. SCHEDULE (ref. Annex 2)

As per Art. 1.9 of the FIM Sidecar World Championship Regulations:

New Riders/Passengers: full documents check,

All other Riders/Passengers must present a copy of their insurance card for medical purposes due to local requirements.

• **Technical checks:** 22.06.2023 18.00 – 20.00 o'clock (Paddock)

No rider or Sidecar is permitted onto the track unless he/it has passed the technical inspections.

• Riders & passengers Briefing: 22.06.2023 at 20.15 o'clock (Media Center)

All the riders and passengers must attend the compulsory briefing.

#### 8. PRACTISING SCHEDULE

It is strictly forbidden to ride racing Sidecars on the course outside the official practice periods (Friday – Sunday).

# 10. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY-(IES) / PODIUM

The post-race(s) podium ceremony will be held: Autodrom Most official podium directly after each race (Sprint and Main Race).

Trophies will be provided by the Organisers as follow:

• one trophy for each rider and for each passenger of the first three teams classified in each race (Sprint and Main Race).

#### 11. PROTESTS

All protests shall be made in accordance with the requirements of the FIM Disciplinary and Arbitration Code and be accompanied by fee for:

- Sporting protests of 660 EUR;
- Technical protest 660 EUR, plus 250 EUR or 400 EUR (cf Art. 1.27 of the FIM Sidecar World Championship Regulations).

#### **12. FUEL**

If fuel is supplied by the organisers at the fuel-station, it will be in conformity with Art. 2.10 of the FIM Sidecar World Championship Regulations.

#### 13. THIRD PARTY INSURANCE

By endorsing the entry application form, the FMN of the rider and passenger certifies that the rider and passenger are insured in accordance with the FIM requirements.

In conformity with Art. 110.1 of the Sporting Code, third party insurance in respect of riders covering accidents occurring during the meeting including practices will be the responsibility of the organiser.

This insurance includes a minimum guarantee of 10 000 000 EUR.

The organiser disclaims all responsibility for damage to a Sidecar, its accessories and components arising out of an accident, fire or other cases.

## 14. RENUNCIATION OF ANY RECOURSE AGAINST SPORTING AUTHORITIES

Apart from the requirements of the FIM Sporting Code, riders and teams by participating renounce all rights of appeal against the organiser, his representatives or agents by arbitration or before a tribunal or any other manner not foreseen by the FIM Sporting Code for any damages for which they could be liable in consequence of all acts or omissions on the part of the organiser, his officials, representatives or agents in the application of these regulations or contributed to or arising out of their actions.

## 15. SIDECARS EQUIPMENT

#### 15.1 FIM HOMOLOGATED HELMETS







The use of FIM Homologated helmets is mandatory for the FIM World Championships and prizes competitions. Please refer to Art. 2.11.6 & 2.11.7 of the FIM Sidecar World Championship Technical regulations.

#### **15.2 ON-BOARD CAMERA**

An on-board-camera (other than the one or permitted by the FIM Administration) is not allowed during the entire event, from the practice sessions until the end of the event. If riders wish to place their own on-board camera, they must contact the TV Department of the FIM Administration and the promoter, for approval.

#### 16. CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT

Should an event of Force Majeure arises, defined as any act, event or omission that is beyond the reasonable or actual control of the party affected thereby including any strike, labour disturbance or lockout (except, in each case, of its own employees or, in the case of the Promoter, those of its affiliates), fire, failure of public utility, abnormally inclement climate or weather conditions, flood, lightening, earthquake, subsidence, structural damage, natural disaster, act of god, government action (including any change to any Applicable Law), riot, disease, epidemics or pandemics, civil commotion or armed conflict, war, terrorist action or the threat of any of the foregoing, the Event of the FIM World Championship may be postponed or cancelled. For this, the FIM, the Promoter and/or circuit cannot be held liable.

#### **17. CODE OF ETHICS**

All persons participating or involved in any capacity in an FIM Sports event or FIM activity, or acting on behalf of the FIM commits themselves to respect and apply the FIM Ethical Code.



# FIM Riders' insurance information

The rider's insurance policy set up by the FIM is a service for all the Federations that are part of the programme

for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2024.

#### Who is covered:

- Riders with a FIM licence issued by a Federation which is part of the FIM riders' insurance programme.
- Riders with a FIM licence issued by ACCR, DMSB, FMS, KNMV, NMF and SMF are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation
- Riders competing in MotoGP, Moto2, Moto3 and MotoE are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation.
- Riders competing in a Cross Country Rally must follow the guideline of the Rally organiser.

#### Validity of the insurance:

- For all events on the FIM Calendar with an International Manifestation Number (IMN).
- For racing activities included in the official programme of the event only!
- - Travel to and from the event venue.

#### **Scope of coverage:**

In case of racing incident, the FIM riders' insurance programme would cover:

- Emergency Medical treatment on the event's place (subsidiary and complementary to any other insurances the rider may hold)
- Repatriation to the rider's country of residence (as declared on the FIM Licence extranet by the rider's FMN)
- **Death and Disability** (Riders with a FIM licence issued by FFM and FMI have not subscribed this benefit from the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation for this benefit)

Please note that this is an EMERGENCY insurance and in order to avoid any problems please follow the correct procedure.

# What to do?

#### **Before departure:**

- Always check beforehand whether your personal health insurance card is still valid.
- For European citizens, please travel with your European Health insurance card.

# In case of an Emergency Incident / Urgent medical assistance need:

## When contacting any of the claims team you will need to provide:

- Your FIM licence number and your contact details
- > The FIM event number: IMN
- > The venue of the event

#### **Important notes:**

- · When you are being transported to hospital for medical examinations treatment and/or assessment:
  - Always take your documents related to your personal health insurance and to the FIM riders' insurance programme when you are being transported.
- When receiving medical assistance at the event/hospital:
  - You/a nominated representative must always receive a complete clinical record of all medical examinations, treatment and assessment.
- Always provide the insurance file number provided to you during your first call.



- Make sure your Federation indicates the correct country of residence in your details and your correct emergency
  and authorized contact persons. Any repatriation will be to the address/country provided by your Federation on
  the FIM Extranet site.
- The FIM riders' insurance programme is only valid at FIM-approved events with a valid Number (IMN). If you are attending private test and/or non-event practice days, YOU WILL NOT BE COVERED by the FIM insurance.
- Always follow the instructions or you may no longer be covered by the FIM riders' insurance programme!
- Please ensure you agree upon any medical care or medical arrangements with the FIM insurer before taking any action whatsoever!



- Do not delay in contacting the emergency helpline. Make the call as soon as you can to advise of your accident!
- Do not change or leave the hospital, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM insurance services may not be provided.
- Do not leave the country in which the incident occurred, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM Insurance services may not be provided.
