The FIM and Infront Moto Racing would like to announce the following updates to the 2023 calendar of the FIM Motocross World Championship and the Monster Energy FIM Motocross of Nations.

The Monster Energy FIM Motocross of Nations previously scheduled for 22nd October in Ernée, France, will be brought forward to October 6th, 7th & 8th.

Consequently, the rescheduling includes a date change of the MXGP of Great Britain which will be held in Matterley Basin and will also be brought forward to 30 September and 1 October.
