## 4 Entries

## 4.1 Closing Date for Entries

In accordance with Article 3 above.

## 4.2 Entry Procedure

- 4.2.1 Entries must be submitted in accordance with Article 82.4 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.
- 4.2.2 Entries must be made using the online form available on the website <u>Jordan Baja</u> and on <u>Sportity</u> App. If the application is sent by fax, by email or made electronically, the original duly signed entry form must be submitted during the administrative checks.
- 4.2.3 Anyone wishing to take part in the event must send the entry form, duly completed, to the secretariat of the event no later than the schedule mentioned in Article 3 above, accompanied by:
  - The entrant's full name as it appears on the competition licence (copy required).
  - The full name of rider, his nationality and address.
  - The full name of co-rider (SSV only), his nationality and address.
  - FIM Competition license number and driving license number of the rider (copies required).
  - FIM Competition license number and driving license number of the co-rider (SSV only, copies required).
  - The characteristics of the vehicle, group, and class.
  - The FMN Homologation papers.
  - Rider passport or identification (copy required).
  - Co-Rider (SSV only) passport or identification (copy required).
  - Valid motorcycle insurance certificate to cover third party liability.
  - If the first rider is not the entrant, then a copy of the entrant's licence must be submitted with the entry form.
- 4.2.4 To be eligible to score points in the FIM Asia Baja's Championship the competitor/rider/codriver (SSV) must be from a country affiliated with FIM Asia Continental Union and be holder of a passport of a member country of FIM Asia.
- 4.2.5 Championship points will automatically be awarded to the rider/co-driver (SSV) if the above condition is met.

#### 4.3 Number of competitors accepted

- 4.3.1 The maximum number of riders shall be limited to "30". If more than the maximum number of riders is received, the acceptance of entries will be at the sole discretion of the Organiser.
- 4.3.2 The minimum number of riders required is "10". If that number is not reached, the Organiser may cancel the competition after obtaining the FIM's approval.





### 4.4 Accepted Classes

- 4.4.1 FIM / FIM Asia categories are:
  - Category 1: Motorcycles up to 450cc (single or twin cylinder 2T or 4T)
  - Category 2: Quads (3-wheel vehicles are not allowed)
  - Category 3: Trail (more than 600cc, twin cylinder or more and with the minimum weight of 165kg. The maximum speed for this category is 130 km/h.)
  - Category 4: SSV
  - Class 1: Women
  - Class 2: Junior
  - Class 3: Veterans

## 4.4.2 Organiser Category:

 Category 5: Motorcycles over 450cc (single or twin cylinder 2T or 4T) does not count towards FIM Bajas World Cup or FIM Asia Baja Championship.

- 4.5.1 Above mentioned fees include Sales Tax & the organisers optional advertising, if a competitor does not accept the optional advertising the entry fee will be increased by 100% in accordance with Article 82.4 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.
- 4.5.2 Riders / SSV Crews wishing to install extra Tracking & Navigation device to their vehicle will have to pay an additional \$300 (non-refundable), they MUST send the request to the Organisers (info@jordanbaja.com) no later than the date mentioned in Article 3 Programme.
- 4.5.3 Riders / SSV Crews wishing to use the Electronic Road Book MUST email the organisers (info@jordanbaja.com) no later than the date mentioned in Article 3 Programme, rental fee is an additional \$300 (non-refundable), Electronic Road Book installation kit cost is \$275 (if needed) non-refundable.
- 4.5.4 Tracking & Navigation device installation kit (if required) is an additional \$150 (non-refundable).

#### ALL BANK CHARGES & EXPENSES MUST BE PAID BY THE SENDER UPON TRANSFER

## 4.7 Entry fee refund

The entry fee shall be refunded in full:

- If the event does not take place.
- To applicants whose entry application is refused.

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

#### 4.8 Waivers

By Signing and Submitting their entries, the competitors, riders, co-drivers, vehicle owners and team members, waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the FIM, FMN, RACJ, JMS, Organizer, and all the Rally officials, Sponsors and other Competitors, Riders & Co-drivers. The Competitors, riders & co-drivers, renounces all rights to enforce any compensation for any damages and/or losses and/or harms, which might be result of accidents occurred during the Rally to them and/or their personnel members and/or their accompanying persons and/or their equipment. This renouncement refers to the FIM, FMN, RACJ, JMS, Organiser, and all the rally officials, Sponsors and other Competitors, Riders & Co-drivers, (also to any accompanying event(s) run at the same time and on the same route).

The Entry to the Rally is the conclusion of a civil law contract with the Organiser. It also means the consent of the Team / Competitor / Rider / Co-Driver for the processing of personal data for purposes related to the organization of this Rally, and the whole series of Competitions in which the Rally is organized. This entry also means consent to the publication of Team / Competitor / Rider / Co-Driver image and its/his/her results. A Team / Competitor / Rider / Co-Driver has the right to access its/his/her personal data, correct them and request to cease processing of these data. A request to cease processing of its/his/her personal data means resignation from participation in the Competition.

## 5 Insurance

#### 5.1 Third Party Insurance

The Entry Fee includes the insurance premium, which guarantees the Competitors cover for civil liability towards third parties (Public Liability). The indemnity provided under this insurance is the equivalent of \$120'000 as total maximum liability cover.

This insurance will commence come into effect and terminate as follows:

- Start on Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
- End on Monday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

The beneficiaries are covered by the insurance while on the course of the 2025 Jordan Baja, throughout the duration of the event. During that time, competitors who have retired or been disqualified continue to be covered by insurance, if they join the finish control or the nearest port of embarkation via the most direct route from the location where they have retired or been disqualified. Vehicles having retired and re-started shall not be considered to have permanently retired.

## 5.2 Insurance Company

The insurance company & policy details will be published in a bulletin.

#### 5.3 Exclusion

The insurance policy on no account covers the theft of vehicles, spare parts, or any other properties.

The service, auxiliary & truck vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the Organisers, are not covered by the insurance policy of the rally; hence, their insurance policies remain the sole responsibility of the owner.





#### 5.4 Organisers Liability

The Organisers decline liability for any accident caused to competitors and competing vehicles during the whole of the event, any in case of cataclysm, riots, demonstrations, vandalism etc. Competitors and crewmembers will have to sustain all consequences (damages, fines, and penalties) created by any accidents. Organisers also decline any liability for breach of the Jordanian Laws and regulations.

#### 5.5 Additional Insurance

In addition to the insurance covered by the Organiser, all Competitors are required to provide their own insurance covering all vehicles used in Jordan to cover civil liability towards third parties for the entire duration of their visit in the case of foreign competitors, or permanent cover in the case of Jordanian residents. This is to cover competitors while they are on the road sections, or on public roads or highways. Competitors must obtain information from their FMN concerning the cover afforded by their riders' competition licence. They are also recommended to take out additional insurance with an insurance company of their choice.

#### 5.6 Proof of Insurance

All Competitors must be able to present the insurance papers at the Administrative Checks. The burden of proof for a valid insurance rest solely on the competitor.

#### 5.7 In case of accident

During the Baja, in case of an accident, the competitor or his representative must make a written statement to the Clerk of the Course, the competitor relations officer, or directly to the Organiser, within 24 hours. This statement must mention the circumstances of the accident and the contact details of the witnesses.

## 6 Advertising and Identification

#### 6.1 Obligatory Organiser's Advertising

Competition Numbers, Rally Plates and Advertising will be provided by the Organiser and must be affixed to the Bike/Quad/SSV in the stated positions (see Appendix 3 of these regulations) prior to scrutineering.

Text of the obligatory advertising is "2025 Jordan Baja".

## 6.2 Optional Advertising

- 6.2.1 The text will be announced to competitors in a Bulletin.
- 6.2.2 Spaces on the Bike/Quad/SSV must be kept free, see Appendix 3 for the location of the Optional Advertising.
- 6.2.3 The absence or incorrect affixing of the plates or bib will entail a penalty as mentioned in Appendix 8 of these regulations.

#### 6.3 Restrictions on Advertising

Competitors are allowed to affix any kind of advertising to their motorcycles, if:

- 6.3.1 It is authorised by the FIM Regulations and the National Laws.
- 6.3.2 It is not contrary to public decency and customs.
- 6.3.3 It does not overlap on those areas which are reserved for the number plates and the organiser's requirements, as described in these regulations.
- 6.3.4 It is not likely to give offence.
- 6.3.5 It is not political or religious in nature.

## 6.4 National Restrictions on Advertising

6.4.1 Tobacco: According to the Jordanian legislation, Advertising of tobacco, tobacco products e-cigarettes vapes and imitations, as well as smokers' requisites is forbidden on competing vehicles, service vehicles, and equipment and on the rider and team members' outfit.





6.4.2 Alcohol: According to the Jordanian legislation, Advertising of alcoholic beverages is forbidden and not allowed on competing vehicles, service vehicles, equipment, and on the rider and team members' outfit.

#### 6.5 Number Plates

In accordance with Article 82.7.5 of the FIM 2025 BWCR, the organisers will provide each competitor with the following identification plates:

- 6.5.1 For Bikes:
  - One front number plate 17x23cm
  - Two side number plates 17x23cm
  - Two compulsory advertising plates 8x12cm
  - Two optional advertising panels 8x12cm (+100% increase entry fee if rejected)
  - Race bib 26x30cm
- 6.5.2 For Quads:
  - 28x18cm
  - Race bib 26x30cm
- 6.5.3 For SSV:
  - One roof plate 42x44cm
  - Two side plates 42x44cm
  - Race bib 26x30cm

#### 6.6 Competition Numbers

Competition numbers will be assigned by the organisers, Competitors have no right to protest or complain on this matter.

## 7 Tyres

## 7.1 Compliance

- 7.1.1 In accordance with Article 82.7.4 of the FIM 2025 BWCR, the number of tyres is limited to one set (front(s) & rear(s)) per race day, the tyres could be marked by the FIM Technical Director and/or his appointed crew.
- 7.1.2 Tyres must comply with Article 01.47 of the FIM 2025 Bajas Technical Rules.

## 8 FUEL

#### 8.1 Compliance

8.1.1 In accordance with the FIM 2025 Fuel Regulations.



# 9 Administrative Checks

### 9.1 Documents to be presented

9.1.1 To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

#	Document
1	Completion of all details on the Entry Form
2	Motorcycle/Quad/SSV documents and Registration papers
3	Authorisation of the owner of the vehicle (if different from the competitor/rider)
4	Rider/SSV Crew valid passports / identification
5	Competitor / Entrant valid competition license
6	Rider/SSV Crew FIM valid competition licenses
7	Rider/SSV Crew valid driving licenses

#### 9.2 Timetable

- 9.2.1 The Administrative Checks will take place according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations. A schedule for each Rider/SSV crew will be published in a bulletin.
- 9.2.2 A Time Control (CHV-1) will be installed at entrance of the Administrative Checks.
- 9.2.3 Any rider/SSV Crew reporting outside their time schedule for administrative checks the competitor will be penalised \$15/min to a maximum of 15 minutes, thereafter the competitor will be reported to the Jury who may apply a penalty at their discretion.

#### 9.3 Venue

9.3.1 Rally HQ – as per the address in Article 2.9.1.

#### 10 TECHNICAL CHECKS

#### 10.1 Timetable

- 10.1.1 A schedule for each competitor will be published in a bulletin.
- 10.1.2 A Time Control (CHV-2) will be installed at the entrance of Scrutineering
- 10.1.3 Any competitor or representative reporting outside their time schedule for scrutineering the competitor will be penalised \$15/min to a maximum of 15 minutes, thereafter the competitor will be reported to the Jury who may apply a penalty at their discretion.

#### 10.2 Venue

10.2.1 At the Agaba Service Park, locations as per Article 2.9.7.

#### 10.3 Vehicles Presentation

- 10.3.1 Motorcycle/Trail/Quad/SSV's MUST be road legal i.e., registered and equipped with working headlights & rear lights, in accordance with Article 01.56 of the 2025 FIM Bajas Technical Rules.
- 10.3.2 When checking in at the technical checks time control, competitors must comply with the following:
  - All Rally plates, competition numbers and advertising plates must be already fitted.
  - Present the rider/SSV crew safety equipment for approval.
  - Present NAV/GPS in working order, permanently fitted to the vehicle.

#### 10.4 Rider/SSV Crew Safety Equipment

10.4.1 Helmets, Goggles, Gloves, Long sleeve shirt or overalls, MX boots or racing shoes, MX long race pants, 2 litres camel back which must be full at the start.







### 10.5 Safety equipment

10.5.1 Airbag

- 10.5.1.1 It is compulsory that the riders wear an airbag eligible for competition. By eligible for competition, it is to be understood: an airbag system (complete vest or gilet) inside which the chest and back protector are included. The current version of airbag system eligible for competition is available <a href="here">here</a>.
- 10.5.1.2 At the start of each stage, the competitors must carry one (or 2 depending on the model of his equipment) spare cartridge(s) for his airbag.
- 10.5.1.3 It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that the airbag is operational at the start of the selective section:
- Sufficient battery level.
- Gas cartridge changed in case of previous activation.
- 10.5.1.4 Limb joints protectors: It is recommended that riders wear limb joint protectors for knees, hips, elbow and shoulders. The limb joint protectors, if present, should be certified according to the international standard: EN1621-1, Level 1 or 2
- 10.5.1.5 Chest protector: It is compulsory that riders wear a chest protector. The chest protector must be certified according to the international standard: EN 1621-3, Level 1 or 2.



10.5.1.6 Back protector: It is compulsory that riders wear a back protector. The back protector must be certified according to the international standard: EN 1621-2, Level 1 or 2, only CB (Central Back) or FB (Full Back).





- 10.5.2 Tracking System: Anube Sport will provide the safety tracking services using a special device which will provide both tracking and navigation.
- 10.5.3 All vehicles must only be fitted with the Safety Tracking System provided by the Organiser. The instructions for the use of the Tracking System is in the Appendix 5 of these Regulations.
  - Tracking devices shall be collected during the Administrative Checks as per Article 3 Programme
  - The Tracking Officer will collect the devices from the motorcycles/SSV's at the finish Parc Fermé.

#### 10.6 Connection of the system

Throughout the Baja, competitors are responsible for the correct functioning of their Tracking System. It must be functioning and stay permanently connected, with power cables and the aerial connected throughout the length of each Stage. Any incident caused by the competitor (loss, destruction, being switched off etc.) and/or all attempts of a fraudulent nature or manipulation will result in penalties, up to disqualification, to be decided by the International Jury.

## 11 OTHER PROCEDURES

#### 11.1 Riders Briefing

 The riders briefing will be provided electronically and posted on Sportity as per Article 3 -Programme, we will be available during the Administrative Checks to answer any questions the riders may have.

#### 11.2 Pre-Start Area the Ceremonial Start

- Before the start of the Ceremonial Start of the event, all the competing motorcycles/SSV's will be assembled in starting area, they must be ridden/driven (by the rider/one of the crew members) before the start time as detailed in Article 3 Programme of these regulations.
- The holding area for the Ceremonial Start will be secured. Access is limited to Riders & Crew members and Media representatives carrying the appropriate identification / accreditation.
- Refuelling is strictly forbidden in the Pre-Start holding Area(s), any kind of other service will be reported to the Jury who may impose a penalty.
- Entering the pre-start holding area outside the indicated time frame according to Article 3
  Programme of these regulations up to a maximum of 30 minutes, will incur a penalty of \$150.
  Any lateness over 30 minutes, the competitor involved will be reported to the Jury who may apply penalties at their discretion.

## 11.3 Ceremonial Start Procedures & Start Order

- The Ceremonial Start will take place in the "Arab Revolt Plaza" according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations. It is mandatory for the Rider/SSV Crew to attend.
- The Ceremonial start will be in descending motorcycle/SSV number order, starting from the last competitor to the first.
- Motorcycles/SSV will start at one (1) minute interval. Then they will return to the Service Park.
- It is mandatory for all riders/SSV Crews to wear their racing clothes, boots during the Ceremonial Start. Riders/SSV Crews not complying with this will be reported to the Jury who may impose a penalty.
- If a rider/SSV crew is unable to participate in the ceremonial start with their motorcycle/SSV, it shall be permitted to start the event at its allocated start time, subject to passing the necessary technical checks. The rider/crew concerned must still attend the ceremonial start wearing racing clothes and on their due time.
- No Timecards will be used in the ceremonial start, once the rider/crew arrives to the preceremonial start holding area they must follow the marshal's instructions.

#### 11.4 Electronic Start Procedure

- We will be using Chronomoto timing system with their beams and timing equipment.
- Please refer to Appendix 7 of these regulations for the Start Light procedure in the Selective Sections.

#### 11.5 Prologue

As per Article 82.13 of the FIM 2025 BWCR, the following will be applied only for the Prologue:

- Agaba Prologue is located in the TBA Agaba
- The Aqaba Prologue will take place before the Ceremonial Start; all competitors MUST take part therein.





- The official itinerary of the Aqaba Prologue is that shown in the road book/navigation device. To assist the competitors, directions and features of the route may be indicated by means of arrows and/or tape and/or on the navigation device. Should a competitor accidentally leave the route he must retrace his tracks and return to that point before continuing.
- There will be several points on the track that (for penalty purposes), will be as WPP (Precise Waypoint) validation radius of 20 meters (the track will be open on the navigation system, but validation will be only 20 meters).
- The penalty for each missing waypoint is two (2) minutes.
- Start order will be in descending order, last motorcycle/SSV first.
- A Separate start list will be issued for the Agaba Prologue Stage (DSSP).
- The classification of the Prologue counts towards the general classification.
- Abandon: Competitors that fail to finish the Prologue due to breakdown or other circumstances will take the start in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stage. This competitor will receive a penalty that will be the maximum time of the Prologue plus 15 minutes.
- No start: Only in duly acceptable cases of force majeure may the FIM International Jury authorise a competitor that has not participated in the Prologue to take part in the 2<sup>nd</sup> stage. This competitor will receive a penalty that will be the Maximum Time of the Prologue plus 30 minutes.

#### 11.6 Finish Procedure

- The rider/crew or a team member must drive their motorcycle/SSV from the Service Park Parc Fermé to the Finish Holding Area in the "Arab Revolt Plaza" within the open/close time mentioned in Article 3 Programme.
- A Holding Area will be setup on-site, competitors MUST enter the Finish Holding Area and follow marshal's instructions.
- The holding area will be secured. Access is limited to riders/SSV crew members and Media representatives carrying the appropriate identification/accreditation.
- The Podium & Prize Giving will take place according to Article 3 Programme of these regulations. It is mandatory for riders/SSV Crew members to attend.
- The prize giving/trophies will be given in descending order according to classification.
- It is mandatory for all riders/SSV crews to wear their racing clothes and boots during Prize Giving. Riders/SSV crews not complying with this will be reported to the Jury.

#### 11.7 Permitted Early Check In

Early check in is permitted in the following TC's:

- TC 1A Agaba Service Park Service IN
- TC 2A Agaba Service Park Service IN
- TC 3A Aqaba Service Park Parc Fermé IN Finish Stage 2

#### 11.8 Official time used during the event

The official time will be according to the GPS (Jordan time = GMT + 3).

### 11.9 Road books delivery

Road books will be delivered as follows:

Stage 1 / Section 1 Prologue: Thursday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025 @ 13:00

Stage 1 / Section 2: Friday, April 11th, 2025, 30 min. before competitor start time
 Stage 2 / Section 3: Saturday, April 12th, 2025, 30 min. before competitor start time

#### 11.10 Special Procedures and Activities

#### 11.10.1 Availability of Participants

After parking their motorcycle/SSV in the final Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, participants must remain available by phone (mobile).

#### 11.10.2 Classification

The event classifications will not be distributed after the event, they will be published on the website and on the DNB (Sportity).





## 12 SERVICE

#### 12.1 General information

- 12.1.1 There will be one Service Park for the duration of the 2025 Jordan Baja.
- 12.1.2 The Service Park is located Agaba City Old Port as per Article 2.9.7 of these regulations.
- 12.1.3 Service can be done ONLY inside the Service Park.
- 12.1.4 Maximum speed allowed in the Service Park is 30km/h.

#### 12.2 Service Park Access

- 12.2.1 The service park will open for logistics operations only as per Article 3 Programme, the service vehicles will be allowed to enter the service park on that date only to off-load and setup their service area.
- 12.2.2 The service park will be fully operational as per Articles 2.9.2 & 3 of these regulations.

#### 12.3 Assistance

- 12.3.1 Repairs on the Road Sections or Selective Sections of a machine still in the race can be done only by the competitor himself or vehicles/persons officially entered in the race. All infractions will incur penalties up to and including disqualification from the race.
- 12.3.2 Servicing the vehicle in the Neutralisation Zone is allowed only by the Rider/SSV Crew using solely the equipment on board and with no external physical assistance except vehicles/persons officially entered in the race. All infractions will incur penalties up to and including disqualification from the race.
- 12.3.3 A competitor is responsible for his assistance.
- 12.3.4 It is forbidden to transport parts and/or personal effects or assistance, transport or towing by a vehicle and/or a person other than a motorbike or SSV officially entered in and still in the race and their crew.
- 12.3.5 All assistance in an enclosed place, closed or guarded, even if this place is situated within the area of the Service Park is forbidden. A tent is not considered as an enclosed place.

#### 12.3.6 Service Space

- Service space is included in the entry fee, space allocated for each competitor is 25sqm (5x5m). If the entrant requires more space, he can purchase extra space in 25sqm (5x5) increments at \$50/50sqm (5x5m).
- If two or more competitors share the same service area or if the competitor wish to add extra space, the organiser must be informed of this request as per Article 3 Programme of these regulations.

#### 12.4 Service plates


One "Service" plate will be provided to each entrant for free, which can be used for any vehicle, including a truck. Extra plates are available with the following fees:

ltem	Price \$
"SERVICE" Plate	125
"AUXILIARY" Plate	70

- "SERVICE" Plate:
  - Vehicles less than 3,500 kg (van) used as service assistance.
  - These vehicles can enter in the service area every day of the event.
- "AUXILIARY" Plate:
  - Vehicles less than 3,500 kg for the transfer of the team staff.
  - These vehicles can enter in the service area every day of the event.
- All these vehicles must affix their plate on the top centre of the front windshield.
- During the Baja, no vehicle will be permitted to enter the Service Park unless these plates are affixed.







## 12.5 Fuel & Refuelling

#### 12.5.1 Fuel/Refuel (Article 82.16.7 of the FIM 2025 BWCR)

- Refuel Zones inside the Selective Sections will have a virtual time control IN and OUT.
- All Motorcycles/Quads MUST stop at all the Refuel Zones inside the Selective Sections for not less than 3 minutes even if the rider does not need to refuel, stop time will be monitored by Anube Sport.
- No fuel or any flammable liquid may be carried other than in a tank or container permanently attached to the machine.
- In the Service Park it is forbidden to refuel.
- Refuelling is permitted only in the designated commercial fuel stations using fuel on sale to the public.
- The fuel stations authorized will be indicated in the Road Book.
- Refuelling zones will be established in Selective Sections.
- Only the rider may carry out this procedure.

## 12.6 General Regulations for Service

Inside the Service Park the staff in charge for servicing the competitor's Bike/Quad/SSV must wear their wrist bands supplied by the Organisers during administrative checks in a very visible way.

## 12.7 Infractions of the Service and Refuelling rules - Penalties

All the infractions of the Service and Refuelling rules reported by the Judges of Fact or by other Officials will be penalised in accordance with Article 82.16.4 of the FIM 2025 BWCR and Appendix 8 of these regulations.

#### 12.8 Environmental Mat

Inside the service area and the Parc Fermé competitors are obliged to lay under their motorcycles/SSV's a proper environmental mat to avoid the discharge of liquids on the soil in accordance with Article 82.16.4 of the FIM 2025 BWCR. Otherwise, the Clerk of the Course will award a penalty of \$100 against the competitor team.





### 12.9 Garbage Bins

Inside the Service Park, the organiser will place bins for garbage. Competitors must ensure their service location is clean before, during and after the rally, the Clerk of the Course will award a penalty of \$150 to the competitor who has registered the vehicle.

## 13 START OF THE BAJA

### 13.1 Publication of crews eligible to start and start lists

The Starting list for Stage 1 shall be posted on the Digital Official Notice Board (See the Programme in Article 3 of these regulations). The starting list for Stage 2, established according to Article 82.15 of the FIM 2025 BWCR will be posted on the Digital Official Notice Board.

#### 13.2 Official start

The official start of the Baja will take place from TCO Aqaba Prologue.

## 14 RUNNING OF THE BAJA

#### 14.1 Attention

Whilst the route generally avoids being in proximity of farms and inhabited areas, competitors are advised when driving in the vicinity their speed should be restricted. Crews must always take every precaution to minimize the nuisance and disturbance to all forms of livestock and Natural Reserves. Additionally, all Crews participating in the Baja are advised to keep their head lights always on while driving in the stages.

#### 14.2 Road Sections and Selective Sections

- 14.2.1 The itinerary of the Baja is made up of Road Sections with a scheduled time and roads open to traffic.
- 14.2.2 It is not allowed for any competitor to have his vehicle carried on a trailer on road sections as it is part of the competition and any violation of that will be reported to the Jury.
- 14.2.3 The Selective Section on Stage 1 will be run in two parts separated by a Neutralisation Zone. For service in the neutralisation zone refer to Article 12.3.2 of these regulations.

#### 14.3 Speed Control Zone

- 14.3.1 Please refer to Article 82.19 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.
- 14.3.2 The exact speed will be monitored by: Anube Sport

#### 14.4 Retirement

Any competitor who has retired from the event must cross out in black the number plates or remove them and must not continue the route in the company of, or in proximity to any other competitor. If this rule is broken, the competitor may be suspended and any competitor(s) he accompanied may be disqualified (or other penalties given as provided for in the FIM Disciplinary and Arbitration Code).

## 14.5 Start Interval

- 14.5.1 The 1<sup>st</sup> ten riders will start one by one every 2 minutes.
- 14.5.2 The remaining riders will start two by two every 1 minute.

#### 14.6 Maximum Time allowed at the Time Controls

- 14.6.1 A maximum lateness of thirty (30) minutes at every Time Control is authorized. This lateness will be penalized at a rate of 1 minute per minute or fraction of minute according to Article 82.21 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.
- 14.6.2 Any competitor exceeding the maximum lateness of thirty (30) minutes they will not be allowed to start the next TC.





14.6.3 The maximum time allowed as above may be modified at any moment by the Jury, upon the proposal of the Clerk of the Course. Crews will be informed thereof as soon as possible.

#### 14.7 Maximum Time allowed in the Selective Sections

14.7.1 The Maximum Time allowed in the Selective Sections are:

- 14.7.2 Exceeding the maximum time allowed for Selective Sections will be penalised in accordance with Article 82.14.3 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.
- 14.7.3 Waypoint Penalty: Each missed Waypoint will be penalised in accordance with Article 82.11.2.3 of the FIM 2025 BWCR.

## 17 FINAL CHECKS, PROTESTS & APPEALS

#### 17.1 Final Checks

- 17.1.1 The Final Checks will take place, according to the Programme in Article 3, at the Aqaba Service Park.
- 17.1.2 In case of a protest, the said motorcycle/quad/trail/SSV will be checked at the discretion of the Jury.

## 17.2 Protest – Appel

- 17.2.1 Any protest shall be lodged according to the procedure of the FIM Disciplinary Code. It shall be submitted in writing and handed to the Clerk of the Course accompanied by the deposit mentioned below. This deposit will not be returned if the complaint is rejected. If the protest calls for the dismantling and refitting of various parts of a motorcycle/quad/trail/SSV, the complainant shall pay an additional deposit of \$400.
- 17.2.2 Protest deposit: The Protest deposit is fixed at: \$700.
- 17.2.3 Any cost for the work and for transporting the motorcycle/quad/trail/SSV shall be borne by the complainant if the protest is not well founded. In the case of the contrary, it shall be borne by the competitor concerned by the protest.
- 17.2.4 The deadline for submitting a protest will be thirty (30) minutes beginning from the time when the provisional classification is posted on the DNB.
- 17.2.5 Appeal deposit: The Appeal deposit is fixed at: \$1500
- 17.2.6 Payment of fines: fines must be paid in Cash against a receipt.

## FIM Riders' insurance information

The rider's insurance policy set up by the FIM is a service for all the Federations that are part of the programme for the period from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025.

#### Who is covered:

- Riders with a FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence issued by a Federation which is part of the FIM riders' insurance programme.
- Riders competing in MotoGP, Moto2, Moto3 and MotoE are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation.
- · Riders competing in a Cross-Country Rally must follow the guideline of the Rally organiser.

#### Validity of the insurance:

- For all events on the FIM/CONUs/NMFP Calendars with an International Manifestation Number (IMN) or a National Manifestation open to Foreign Participation Number (MNFP).
- For racing activities included in the official programme of the event only!
- Travel to and from the event venue.

#### Scope of coverage:

In case of accident, the FIM riders' insurance programme would cover:

- Emergency Medical treatment on the event's place (subsidiary and complementary to any other insurances the rider may hold)
- Repatriation to the rider's country of residence (as declared on the FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence extranet by the rider's FMN)
- Death and Disability (Riders with a FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence issued by a Federation which has subscribed this benefit through the FIM program)

Coverage is provided only in the country (or countries) where the insured event takes place, which may be anywhere in the world including the insured's principal country of residence.

Please note that this is an EMERGENCY insurance and in order to avoid any problems please follow the correct procedure.

#### What to do?

#### Before departure:

- Always check beforehand whether your personal health insurance card is still valid.
- For European citizens, please travel with your European Health insurance card.

### In case of an Emergency Incident /Urgent medical assistance need:

- Contact the FIM insurer immediately before any action whatsoever

#### When contacting any of the claims team you will need to provide:

- Your FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence number and your contact details
- The FIM event number
- > The venue of the eve







#### **Important notes:**

- When you are being transported to hospital for medical examinations treatment and/or assessment:
  - Always take your documents related to your personal health insurance and to the FIM riders' insurance programme when you are being transported.
- When receiving medical assistance at the event/hospital:
  - You/a nominated representative must always receive a complete clinical record of all medical examinations, treatment and assessment.
- Always provide the insurance file number provided to you during your first call.



- Make sure your Federation indicates the correct country of residence in your details and your correct emergency and authorized contact persons. Any repatriation will be to the address/country provided by your Federation on the FIM Extranet site.
- The FIM riders' insurance programme is only valid at FIM/CONU/MNFP events with a valid Number (IMN) or NMFP. If you are attending private test and/or non-event practice days, YOU WILL NOT BE COVERED by the FIM insurance.
- Always follow the instructions or you may no longer be covered by the FIM riders' insurance programme!
- Please ensure you agree upon any medical care or medical arrangements with the FIM insurer before taking any action whatsoever!



- Do not delay in contacting the emergency helpline. Make the call as soon as you can to advise
  of your accident!
- Do not change or leave the hospital, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM
  insurance services may not be provided.
- Do not leave the country in which the incident occurred, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM Insurance services may not be provided.
