2021 calendars, UPDATE 04 March

German round in Alfsee postponed to 2022

Despite the best efforts of all parties involved and in light of the extensive restrictions and uncertainty related to the ongoing Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, the FIM, DMSB and the local organiser have decided to postpone until 2022, the FIM E-Bike Enduro World Cup & FIM EX-Bike World Cup events, initially scheduled for 11-13 June 2021.

This difficult decision was taken given the sporting format of these races, which were due to take place during the 24h-Alfsee-MTB race, thus making it very complicated to set up the event in compliance with the health measures that are essential to ensure the safety of participants and spectators.

The stakeholders are now focusing on preparing for the 2022 edition which will take place from 17-19 June.
