*** / ** Scoring Coefficients:**

- A FIM Rally (4 to 6 timed stages) will have a scoring coefficient of 1.
- A FIM Marathon Rally (more than 6 timed stages) will have a scoring coefficient of 1,5. The result will be multiplied by 1.5 and then rounded up.

Categories / Classes:

- **FIM World Rally-Raid Championship, Category RallyGP (Moto-Rally)**
 - For experienced riders only. For riders and manufacturers.
 - Tyre: 1 Brand and Type for the entire Event. No change allowed from Start to Finish of a Stage
 - No maximum speed
- **FIM World Rally-Raid World Cup, Category Rally2 (Moto-Rally)**
 - Tyre: Brand and Type Free. No change allowed from Start to Finish of a Stage
 - No maximum speed
 - Women's Trophy for competitors in the Rally2 category
 - Junior's Trophy for competitors in the Rally2 category
 - Veteran's Trophy for competitors in the Rally2 category
- **FIM World Rally-Raid World Cup, Category Rally3 (Moto-Enduro)**
 - Tyre: Brand and Type Free. No change allowed from Start to Finish of a Stage
 - Maximum speed: 130 km/h
 - Junior's Trophy for competitors in the Rally3 category
- **FIM World Rally-Raid World Cup, Category Quad**
 - Tyre: Brand and Type Free. No change allowed from Start to Finish of a Stage
 - Maximum speed: 130 km/h
